
### Holy Week Relay Fast Mar 26 - Mar 30

This season is a preparation for the celebration of Easter and helps Christians develop spiritual disciplines.

### **BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATE**

(from 2023 Annual Report)

We are almost there!! The much-anticipated completion of Westside's addition/renovation is just around the corner, and as we all look forward to that day, your Building Committee ask that you patiently bear with us for just a little longer as there is still considerable detailed work remaining.

As we wait for just a little longer, let us be encouraged by the patience our forefathers exhibited while they waited upon the Lord. Scripture is filled with many examples of God's people waiting patiently. A good example for us to consider, is the story of Zechariah and Elizabeth. They had been asking God for a child for many years, and when Elizabeth was well beyond childbearing age, God answered their prayers (Luke 1: 5-17). Their experience demonstrates a vital truth: God's timing is rarely our own, but His is always worth waiting for. Keeping that in mind, your Building Committee has listed below the work in progress.

- parking lots have their first coat of asphalt

- parking lot lighting to begin weather permitting
- curbs poured
- exterior door into the auditorium being replaced
- exterior Osborne St. door being replaced
- railings, where required to be installed
- exterior siding on addition to be completed
- south facing auditorium windows being replaced
- all exterior windows in the addition being installed
- elevator installation being completed
- exterior/ interior walls being insulated and dry walled
- kitchen plumbing and venting being completed
- handicap washroom on the lower-level nearing completion when functional, remaining washroom renovations will begin
- prep work for rug installation in the sanctuary to begin shortly
